


If we knew the gift of God

We all start with what we think we want and we rush out to get it, trying to fill an empty hole inside us. It's been said that the joy of buying something new lasts until we take it home and open the box! All the fun is in the buying of it but we then ask ourselves, "Am I any happier, am I any more now that I have this new thing?" But still we continue to rush out to buy more and more, and each time always thinking, "This will do it, this will fill the emptiness, this will take away my inner thirst."

The work of mature religion is to lead us beyond what we think we want to what we really need. The woman in the gospel has come to the well because she needs water.

Jesus tries to lead her, step by step, beyond what she thinks she wants and to help her see that water is just the symbol of what she really needs. He's not talking about water. He's talking about spirit. He makes her aware of her own thirst, her own hunger, her own need. Then he leads to a rather profound theological reflection on the universality and availability of God. He refers to the conflict between the Jews and the Samaritans, both groups claiming to have the truth. Jesus tells her that the time is coming when both will realise that they missed the point. If we don't get the spirit, if we don't find the living water, then it doesn't matter which group we belong to: nothing can ever substitute for inner experience. And he uses the most wonderful metaphor for this inner experience: 'a fountain within you bubbling up unto eternal life.'

Spiritual knowing, spiritual cognition is always really re-cognition. It's the realisation that "I already knew this. At some deep level I had a premonition, a suspicion, an intuition that this might be true: that I might just be the son/daughter of the holy one, a beloved child of God." But then we'll say, "O but that's too good to be true."

Jesus said to the woman very directly, "If you but knew the gift of God." Many of us don't. We're still trying 'to get it.' We already have the gift of God. From our very beginning every one of us is a child of God. *That* is the water bubbling up from within us but we don't dare to believe it. We shout out, "Lord I am not worthy." The good news is that worthiness is not even the issue. Who is worthy? When we stop seeking our own worthiness, that's when the fountain begins to bubble and we begin to know the gift of God, that it's all gift, and it's all free and all we can do is learn to enjoy it.
