

The feast of the Holy Trinity is essentially a feast about the mystery of God's love for humanity. It is all about relationship. It arose out of the lived experience of the early Christian Church. Rooted in One God, their experience of the Risen Christ and being animated with his Spirit led the first Christians to experience one God in three ways:

As the God of Judaism – the Transcendent source of everything that is

As God present in Jesus – as they came to recognize his divinity as God's word or wisdom

As God the Spirit present in their hearts.

'When we describe God, we can only use similes, analogies, and metaphors. All theological language is an approximation, offered tentatively in holy awe. That's the best human language can achieve. We can say, "It's like . . ." or "It's similar to . . ."; but we can never say with absolute certainty, "It is . . ." because we are in the realm of beyond, of transcendence, of mystery. We absolutely must maintain a fundamental humility before the Great Mystery; otherwise, religion worships itself and its formulations instead of God. Yet Mystery isn't something we cannot understand. Mystery is endlessly understandable. There is no point at which we can say, 'I've got it'. Always, and forever, Mystery gets you. Trinity is saying, "In the beginning is the relationship." When we start with God as relationship, we begin the spiritual journey on a very different foundation. This foundation is not static but continually evolving and creating new forms of communion and interdependence.
