Story time

Reading Den

Reading is an important part of our day, both with an adult and also having somewhere comfy and relaxing to go for children to explore and look at books.

Can you make yourself a relaxing, cosy reading den?

Number and Memory

Put some items on a tray, table or floor. Cover them up and let the children guess how many items are underneath. What items do the children think there are?

Uncover and count the items! Explore taking one away, putting one in, are there more or less?

Try taking an item away whilst your child closes their eyes - can you identify which item is missing?

Thank you to all for engaging with our home learning ideas. Please don't worry if you are unable to complete all of these or do different activities!

The main things to keep doing each day are reading, talking, counting as much as possible and singing your favourite songs and rhymes.

Numberblocks and Alphablocks are good educational programmes to watch at home to support development in number and sounds.
