

### English – Classic Stories

The children will be reading and responding to classic stories – the main story will be the Enormous Turnip. They will write their own classic story about a vegetable that grows so big it needs lots of people to help harvest it.

#### Recounts

We will be looking at and writing a first-person recount about a visit in the local area.

### RE

Our topic is the Resurrection. This topic will develop the children's knowledge and understanding of the Resurrection of Jesus. The children will learn that Easter is the most important Christian feast because Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Sunday. They will learn about the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and reflect on times when their own sadness turned to joy. They will be introduced to Thomas the apostle and reflect on the importance of his story.

### Maths

The children will continue to master counting in multiples of twos, fives and tens. They will be introduced to the concepts of equal groups and arrays to help them to understand multiplication and division. They will also recall and use facts about doubles and halves of numbers. They will learn to find halves and quarters of objects, shapes and numbers. In geometry, the children will explore position and direction, learning to describe movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

### PE

Thursday – The children will be developing travelling, rolling and jumping skills linked to the Jack and the Beanstalk story. They will link combinations of 2/3 skills. e.g travel and balance.

Friday - The children will be developing their catching and throwing skills and applying these skills in team games.

## Summer Term Growth and Green Fingers



### Science

The children will be learning to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

### Art

The children will be learning how to make observational drawings of plants and flowers in detail. They will use water colour to paint plants and flowers. We will be looking at a range of artists including Paul Klee and Claude Monet and responding to their work.

### Geography

In this theme children will learn simple fieldwork skills, including observation and recording, to study the geography of their school and its grounds. They will investigate the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.

### Computing

The children will be learning about uses of information technology in the world around them. They will learn about algorithms and explore how to find errors in simple programs.
