Who is in our class?

PE Days ~ Thursday (indoors) which will be led by Rachael from Step by Step dance. Fridays will be outdoor (weather permitting) led by Team Theme. Please make sure your child has their full PE kit in school at all times. Can you also make sure their PE kit is named - this makes it much easier to return if anything is lost or misplaced.

Spellings ~ Spellings will be practised daily in school, these will be sent home each Monday in a home school spelling book, please encourage your child to practise their spellings at home daily

Reading ~ Please encourage your child(ren) to read each night, where possible, this can be a book of their own, a magazine, a newspaper or a home school reading book. A reading record will be sent home for you to sign. Pupils who practise their reading regularly at home and answer questions about what they have read tend to make significant progress. Children will be sent home with comprehension questions for each fiction book, reading books will not be swapped until this is completed.

Homework ~ Homework will be given out on a Monday and Friday (starting on the 11th and 15th September). The children's homework will vary each week and may consist of a written, number or topical task. This homework will be in addition to reading practise. Monday's homework should be returned by Thursday and Friday's by Tuesday. This is an important part of reinforcing and extending learning from daily school lessons and preparing them for high school. If homework is not handed in on time, it will not be marked. Children who don't complete homework will complete it in school during their break time.

I will contact each of you personally, should there be any need to discuss your child's progress and I encourage you to come and see me should you have any questions or concerns. I will keep you informed of curriculum updates and term news through the school's newsletter.
