Sports Premium Funding 2016-17

Holy Family Catholic Primary School recognises the contribution of PE to the health and wellbeing of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

In 2016-17 financial year, we will receive £8,573 PE funding.

Objectives

To raise the quality of teaching in PE and sport, ensuring that standards are at least good.
To provide more opportunities for after school activities and intra school competitions.

Planned Actions

Hire qualified sports coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE

We will organise for specialist coaches to come into school, including Team Theme, Step By Step Dance company. Our teachers will observe and participate in the sessions to develop their own skills so that they can then teach this area themselves, once the coach has completed their course of teaching.

Provide a range of after school sports clubs and opportunities

We aim to provide clubs for football (boys and girls), hockey, netball skills, multi-sports, dodgeball, street dance, rugby, basketball, yoga for children. Some clubs will run throughout the year however others will run at various times of the year. Clubs run by external coaches will have a minimal charge and clubs run by school staff will be free.

Provide opportunities for children to compete

We will arrange to take part in tournaments and fixtures arranged by Sports Development Team or through links with local schools. Training and practise sessions will run as after school clubs or during lunchtimes to enable pupils to improve before competitions. Where needed we will provide transport and equipment.

Provide training for lunchtime supervisors to introduce playground games at lunchtimes

Our lunchtime supervisors will be trained to offer children a positive play opportunity during the lunchtime break.

We have also:

Purchased new sports equipment to enable all pupils to be able to participate fully in lessons.

Purchased a new team kit – pupils will have a higher self-esteem and sense of pride for their team

Impact of 2016-17

Staff now have greater confidence in planning and delivery of PE lessons especially dance. There has been a significant increase in children attending after school clubs and participation in PE and Sport. We have specifically targeted pupil premium children who would not have the opportunity to attend a dance club, also children who are at risk of obesity.

Pupils have had greater opportunities to participate in competitions – multi-skills, dance festival, netball, hockey, football

Pupils are beginning to build their self-esteem and have a sense of pride for their team.
